We want to show you some of the new and amazing opportunities that can be available in the future at MAX IV in the field of infrared chemical imaging.

We also invite you to take an active role in the discussions and the planning of which scientific directions we should chose. This is the time for you to make sure that your research takes full advantage of the potentials that could be offered at the MAX IV facilities.

Since we can increase the brilliance by 100 with respect to the old IR-beamline at MAX-lab we can for instance equip the new IR-beamline for:


- Scanning-probe two-dimensional chemical imaging, down to 30 nanometer resolution
- Three-dimensional chemical tomography
- Super-resolution chemical imaging (at the diffraction limit)
- Spectroscopy at extreme conditions,
 (High pressure GPa and low temperatures 4.2K)

Because most of the technicalities associated with the extraction of infrared light at MAX IV have been solved we can focus the workshop on your science and on the specifics of your samples.
